Quite far enough to find.


I love you because you

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
## *Love*

and continually visited and abandoned by the tides.





It is a common search for the good and the beautiful.


It is establishing a relationship in which the independence is equal,

A new direction which requires acceptance, patience and understanding.


Acceptance for differences for the struggles and hardships,

Give them to each other as the greatest gift of all.

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
### ***Closing reading***
